PBCA Dues Paid

There are 415 homes in Pine Brook. So far in 2005, we have 268 homes (or 64%) paying their annual dues which is down slightly from the 67% response we had last year. The \$50 yearly fee represents your fair share of the expenses of the Civic Association. Random Thoughts

Many of our neighbors have e-mailed the PBCA board with suggestions or items to be included in the newsletter. Here are some of them:

- 1. Please remind everyone that Township laws require all trees to be trimmed so there is at least 12 feet clearance for all limbs hanging over the street and 8 feet of clearance above sidewalks. Remember that bushes also must be trimmed so they do not block the sidewalk for people walking.
- 2. Unfortunately, the sidewalk in front of your house is your responsibility. This means you have to fix or replace sections that have been cracked or pushed up by tree roots. Someone, anyone (a child on a bicycle) could trip, fall, etc. and seriously injure themselves. Remember, an ounce of prevention is worth a pound of lawsuit.
- 3. Please remember to pick up after your pets. For those of you that do this ...thanks very much. For those who do not, people are watching and they are more than happy to call the





whether this portable restroom, along with weekly cleaning service, could be discretely placed at the Pavilion Park for the last two months of summer. We're interested in seeing if the Pavilion Park will be used more for picnics and parties if there are restroom facilities there.

Vandalism Zero Tolerance

The police want to be notified of all incidents so they can track where problem areas are.

Over the past few years we've had a door broken at the Pavilion, a picnic table broken at the Hidden Park as well as other incidents. Accidents do happen, but unless we hear directly from the parties involved first, we will be calling the police to report acts of vandalism.

PBCA Dues Drive Continues

By now every resident has gotten their \$50 annual dues notice and many have responded. So far this year, 256 homes have sent in their checks bringing the current dues paying membership to 61% of the 415 homes that make up Pine Brook.

Trees and Lawns

Here are the regulations regarding tree and lawn maintenance as found in Chapter 10, Section 102 of the Hampden Township Code of Ordinances.

All people owning or occupying any property within the Township must keep limbs, branches or growth of trees, shrubbery, bushes or other plant growth trimmed at least 12 1/2 feet in height or clearance above any highway, road, street or alley; and at least 8 feet in height or clearance over any sidewalk or footway. No tree or shrub growing next to a sidewalk may grow in such a manner as to obstruct, impede or interfere with people walking.

It is unlawful to permit grass, weeds or similar vegetation to grow more than 6 inches high or to remain standing in any yard, vacant lot or other place except as may be approved by this Township.

Any person, firm or corporation who shall violate any provision of this Part can be convicted to pay a fine of not more than \$600 plus costs and, in default of payment of said fine and costs, may be imprisoned to a term not to exceed 30 days. Each day that a violation of this Part continues shall constitute a separate offense.

If you see a home that is in violation, try talking to the owner first. Maybe they are on vacation. Maybe they have at the Front Entrance in her spare time. However, because of demands on her time, she is only able to do so much work.



arrangement to get electricity to the front entrance property on the creek side, and we'll be replacing the lamps that used to be there.

The Japanese Beetle grubs did a job on the Pavilion Park property last fall (as they did in many places) and we will need to apply grub killer this year, and reseed areas. There will be signs posted when this happens. HMMS Soccer is going to use the Pavilion field this spring for games as they are already scheduled, but will not be using the Pavilion Park for a year afterwards so the grass can get a strong foothold.

A note to parents: We had some small damage done to a picnic table in the Hidden Park that appears to be the work of kids. Accidents happen, silly things happen, we've all been kids and we've all had our share of incidents. If there's been damage done to PBCA property, we think that residents ought to let the PBCA know, particularly if they did the damage. It's better to hear directly from someone involved than to hear it from others. Please let us know.

We have taken a look at the results from the Transportation Safety survey we sent out late in 2004. We received 55 responses (a little more 10% of the homes in our neighborhood) and among the respondents there's specific concern about speeding on Orrs Bridge Road, and speeding and stop sign running within the streets of our neighborhood. We've sent this information to the other Homeowners Associations on Orrs Bridge Road so they can share that information to their residents as well. 

President's Corner:

This is my first "President's Corner" in the newsletter, and there's a lot I need to accomplish in this space. First of all, again I'd like to thank Fred Briggs, PBCA's President for the last two years, for coordinating the talents and skills of the PBCA Board, block captains and membership in a way that has left the PBCA in a strong and viable position for the future. We've had another good year, and the Civic Association is healthier than I've seen it, which in my case goes back to 1995.







Hampden Township Proposes Bike Path Along Conodoguinet

You may have heard about the 1½ mile bike path the Township is considering building across the creek from Pine Brook connecting Orrs Bridge Road to Little Run Road in the Country Club Park neighborhood. Township Councilman Don McCallin requested the opinions of PBCA members be included in the newsletter. Here is a very brief look at what each side has to say based on comments submitted in writing or voiced at the meeting on August 30th. More details are available in the minutes of the August meeting on the Pine Brook web site: http://pinebrookcivicassociation.org/

AGAINST

- The proposed Bike Trail/ Road will have a direct environmental impact on the riparian vegetative zone and flood plain.
- This vegetative riparian zone serves as an interface between the Conodoquinet and the surrounding community. It serves as a buffer to pollutants entering the creek from runoff and erosion and functions to reduce non-point pollution coming off the Carlisle Pike.
- A wetland would be intruded upon and a sanctuary for wildlife disrupted. The Conodoquinet Creek in this area serves as a sanctuary for birds of all types especially the wading birds such egrets and herons, also hawks, owls, ospreys, Kingfishers, ducks and songbirds.
- The path will increase flooding in the

FOR

- The Township has a long-standing, continuing program to build upon its bike/walking path network in the Township. The purpose of the path network is: to provide residents, especially children, an opportunity to walk and/or ride bikes in areas away from main highways, to link developments where possible, and to provide a network leading to our major parks at Creekview and Salem Church.
- The asphalt path would be the standard 8 foot wide, would follow the path currently used by the Township Sewer Authority to service its sewer line and would be maintained by the Township Recreation Department.
- Any damage that would have been done to the creek and woodlands due to the construction of this path would

- creek. Water may be trapped behind providing a breeding area for mosquitoes.
- The Bike Trail/ Road will result in a negative impact on Real Estate values in Pine Brook. The residents of Pine Brook who purchased homes along the creek paid a premium price for their homes because of the view, peace, tranquility and wildlife in their backyards.
- There are safety concerns with the bike path ending at Orrs Bridge road. The main concern is that the current bridge is not wide enough to handle bikes and cars at the same time. The county owns the bridge and they have no plans to widen the bridge nor the sidewalk.
- The bike path will increase the number of kids hanging out, partying, creating noise and vandalism on the other side of the creek.
- The township will have to pay for the construction and maintenance of the path. This will include wetland boardwalk maintenance, debris removal and trash clean-up.
- This bike path could be the prelude to development on the other side of the creek. Is this path the beginning of a road? If so, then how long until houses or condos are built?

- have occurred in the 70's when the sewer line was built.
- The path has been granted Federal aid, and will meet all environmental standards.
- Having a paved path will allow the police to increase patrols through the area and/or respond to resident's complaint of noise faster and easier.
- With more parents, dog walkers, joggers, etc. using this path, fewer troublemakers will use these woods to hang out because of the increased chance of getting caught.
- The same arguments were made by residents when the Conodoguinet Youth Park on Orrs Bridge Rd. and the Pine Brook bike path next to the golf course were built. The residents living nearby now are very happy with the results, have had no problems and are glad they were built.
- Building the bike path will stop development across the creek because the Township will own the Right-Of-Ways instead of the current situation where private owners do.
- * Pine Brook has its bike path at the end of Lamp Post Lane. Why are some Pine Brook residents trying to deny the people of Country Club Park their bike path?

The PBCA Board wants to hear from you. Please take the time to fill out the small survey at the bottom of the attached Pine Brook Annual Meeting Proxy form. (Even if you plan on attending the Annual Meeting on October 18th and don't need to use the Proxy Form) Return the form to your Block Captain or mail to the address indicated. The PBCA will not be taking a position on the project, but we will pass on the results of neighborhood survey to the Hampden Township manager as well as the neighborhood via the next newsletter.

Township Manager John Bradley says he has no interest in pitting neighbor against neighbor. If enough people are against the proposed bike path, he will take the budgeted money and build one somewhere else. He welcomes your input, so please write or e-mail him. 





Corrections to the PBCA Directory





Community Emergency Response Team volunteers needed

A CERT (Community Emergency Response Team) is a group that is organized and receives specialized allrisk, all-hazard training that enhances their ability to recognize, respond to and recover from a major emergency or disaster situation; is trained to take care of themselves and others in the absence of emergency responders whose arrival may be delayed due to

the scope of the event; recognizes that a well-prepared community is a valuable resource to the emergency services and enhances the preparedness of their community; and become a valuable resource to the emergency services.

Following a major disaster, factors as number of victims, communication failures and road blockages will prevent people from accessing the emergency services they have come to expect at a moments notice. An example of this would be a hurricane washing out the bridge and knocking down trees along Orrs Bridge Road to such an extent that Pine Brook would be cut off from fire and rescue vehicles for 24 to 48 hours until the roads could be cleared.

The concept was based upon the community wanting to supplement its response capability after a disaster; civilians can be recruited and trained as neighborhood teams that, in essence, will be auxiliary responders. This training was made available nationally by FEMA (Federal Emergency Management Agency) in 1993. PEMA (Pennsylvania Emergency Management Agency) began training county officials as CERT trainers in September 2002, including Cumberland County OEP staff members.

CERT is a positive and realistic approach to emergency and disaster situations where citizens may initially be on their own and their actions can make a difference. While people will respond to others in need without the training, one goal of the CERT program is to help them do so

effectively and efficiently without placing themselves in unnecessary danger. Volunteers will receive free training in basic first aid, basic fire fighting, search-and-rescue, and emergency management. In addition, these volunteers will be trained in dealing with dangers – such as making sure a house is safe for rescuers by turning off the electricity and gas services.

The goal of this program is to help the residents of Cumberland County be self sufficient in a major disaster situation by developing multi-functional teams and be cross-trained in basic emergency skills. Through this program, individuals will learn handson disaster skills that will help them as members of an emergency response team and/or as a leader directing untrained volunteers during an emergency. You would be the eyes and ears for the county and state emer-gency personal until their help could arrive. Neighborhood CERT members would assist in setting priorities and let-ting the state officials know who needs help now and the amount of emergency help Pine Brook needs. There is no cost for the CERT training, and the classes are approximately 2 ½ to 3 hours per session.

Volunteers for CERT training can be of all ages. Certainly adults would be preferred, but teens from 14 on up – while not receiving full training – could be used as runners or helping in search & rescue assignments. Also, if you don't want to be a full CERT volunteer but you have job experience that could be helpful -such as contractors, electricians, fire fighting

training in the military, etc. - then please call and volunteer those services.
